MASTER MODEL RAILROADER #114 ALLAN C. PHILLIPS


Allan Phillips has become MMR #114. Allan lives in Jamestown, N.C., with his wife, Jean, and daughter, Patti. Two other grown daughters also live in North Carolina. He has been a regional model contest judge and served as secretary of the MER for two terms.
